Food Pantry News We help an average of 100 families per week at our food pantry. Many of these clients are coming in for the first time. We plan to start being open one Saturday a month to serve those that are working and cannot make our regular weekly hours. Fresh produce and bakery items are provided by Hannaford’s Fresh Rescue Program, NH Food Bank and are very popular. Milk, dairy items, deli sandwiches and frozen meat, as well as non-perishable items are all available to supplement household meals for up to 5 days.
